
The riders will stay overnight at the Old Kingsbury Aerodrome on FM1104 and head back out on the trail on

## **Hello February**

This is the first full week of the month of February.

The Roman month *Februarius* was named after the Latin term *februum*, which means purification, via the purification ritual *Februa* held on February 15 (full moon) in the old lunar Roman calendar. January and February were the last two months to be added to the Roman calendar, since the Romans originally considered winter a **monthless** period.

Its birth flower is the violet (*Viola*) and the common primrose (*Primula vulgaris*)



Its birthstone is the amethyst. It symbolizes piety, humility, spiritual wisdom, and sincerity.

Its zodiac signs are Aquarius (until February 19) and Pisces  $\mathcal{H}$  (February 20 onwards).

The February skies are one of the few that are not blessed with meteor showers, but any cloudless night this month is a good time to bundle up and check out the diamonds in the sky. Maybe there will be the odd shooting star to make it special.

### **Groundhog Day**

Today, Sunday, February 2nd, is Groundhog Day!

According to tradition, if a groundhog comes out of its hole on this day and sees its shadow, there will be six more weeks of winter weather; no shadow means an early spring.

On February 2, 1887, Groundhog Day, featuring a rodent meteorologist, is celebrated for the first time at Gobbler's Knob in Punxsutawney, Pennsylvania. Clymer H. Freas was the editor of the local paper Punxsutawney Spirit at the time, and he began promoting the town's groundhog as the official "Groundhog Day meteorologist".

Groundhog Day has its roots in the ancient Christian tradition of Candlemas Day, when clergy would bless and distribute candles needed for winter. The candles represented how long and cold the winter would be. Germans expanded on this concept by selecting an animal–the hedgehog–as a means of predicting weather. Once they came to America, German settlers in Pennsylvania continued the tradition, although they switched from hedgehogs to groundhogs, which were plentiful in the Keystone State.

Just what the heck is a groundhog anyway? According to Wikipedia: "The groundhog (*Marmota monax*), also known as a woodchuck, or whistlepig, is a rodent of the family *Sciuridae*, belonging to the group of large ground squirrels known as marmots. The groundhog is also referred to as a chuck, wood-shock, groundpig, whistler, thickwood badger, Canada marmot, monax, moonack, weenusk, and red monk. The name "thickwood badger" was given in the Northwest to distinguish the animal from the prairie badger. Monax was an Indian name of the

woodchuck, which meant "the digger". Young groundhogs may be called **chucklings**. Other marmots, such as the yellow-bellied and hoary marmots, live in rocky and mountainous areas, but the groundhog is a lowland creature. It is widely distributed in North America and common in the northeastern and central United States and Canada. Groundhogs are found as far north as Alaska, with their habitat extending southeast to Georgia."

There you have it! Do you want 6 more weeks of winter? It's been a pretty light winter except for that hard, hard freeze a couple of weeks ago. We certainly don't want six more weeks of that!! I'm sure that some of the people up north that are dealing with polar vortexes are looking forward to the groundhog popping up with no shadow in sight.



As we do every year, we'll see if Kingsbury Kliff the Weather-Predicting Armadillo can give us some spring-like weather with a few more cold nights thrown in just to keep the bugs from taking over this summer! Check the Kingsbury website anytime for the local weather forecast - it's probably more reliable than a large rodent or a ... we *still* haven't exactly figured out what an armadillo is!



#### **Burn Ban Reinstated**

On December 17th, 2024 the Guadalupe County Commissioners Court voted to extend the burn ban effective December 31, 2024 through March 2, 2025.

.After a **temporary** burn ban lift, which ended on January 20th, the ban on outdoor burning is back in effect until March 2, 2025



The City of Kingsbury has a "trigger" ordinance where a burn ban is in effect in the city limits whenever there is a burn ban issued by the county.




As always, please take precautions and report any fire hazards immediately to the Kingsbury Volunteer Fire Department at 639-4499 or to the Guadalupe Fire Dispatch at 379-1224. To report a fire, please dial 911.



Of the 254 counties in Texas, there are currently 99 that have a burn ban, down from 100 last month. This leaves 155 counties without a burn ban in the state.

Current burn bans by county in Texas last month and this week.




# **Kingsbury City Limits**


## **Kingsbury VFD And Auxiliary**




## **Fellowship**




# **View of Kingsbury**

A great picture of Kingsbury probably in the 1920s or 30s.It looks like it was a postcard and the sender wrote "How do you like the image of Kingsbury?" It looks like someone else wrote "KINGSBUrY TEX." (with a backwards "S"!) based on the penmanship.

The streets are still unpaved but there are electric poles. The big lumber yard building is still on the tracks in the background and it looks like that's a **hitching** post at the far left of the picture. There are a couple of people on horseback near the windmill, probably getting some water from the trough and resting in the shade of the tree.

The one building has a balcony porch with a chair on it. You could sit there all day and keep tabs on the train, and street activity, and talk to passers-by from your deck!
